KEY SCRIPTURE

2 Corinthians 5:17-19:

¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! ¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: ¹⁹ that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation.

SEEN

1. Prior to meeting, individually spend time meeting God in the key scripture.

2. Read the passage of scripture two times slowly and reflectively. The goal is to allow the text to sink in and resonate personally. Look for words and phrases that stand out to you and write them down.

3. Read the passage slowly one more time, pay extra attention to the parts that stood out to you the first time. Consider how these words or phrases might apply to your life right now. What might the Lord be inviting you to?

4. Respond to God in prayer, express your thoughts, feelings, and desires in relation to the scripture. Rest now in God's presence, allow for silence and stillness. Listen for God's voice and experience a deeper connection with him.

SHAPED

Thinking about the Sunday sermon what stuck out for you in what was said?

In your time reflecting on the key scripture what stood out to you?

The sermon describes four key relationships we were created for: with God, the earth, others, and ourselves. Which of these relationships feels strongest in your life right now? Which feels most broken, and why?

Genesis 3 shows how sin fractures all four relationships, leading us into shame and hiding.

Is there somewhere in your life you are “hiding”?

The message emphasized that reconciliation is part of our mission (2 Corinthians 5). What does it practically look like for you to live as an “ambassador of reconciliation” in your everyday life (home, work, community)?

We’re called not just to believe in reconciliation but to embody it together. What would it look like for KAC to be known in Kamloops as a “bridge-building” church? Where are we already doing this well, and where might God be inviting us to grow?

SENT

Just as we are blessed to be a blessing, in being seen by God, he invites us to truly see others. This week be mindful, is God nudging you to notice someone in your community? Reach out to that person.
